And because behind Sentinelles de la Nature are dedicated men and women, you will always be supported at every step by local organizations at the forefront of environmental and nature conservation.

Led by France Nature Environnement, Sentinelles de la Nature was founded in 2015 in Isère and now covers the entire mainland, as well as French Guiana and Mayotte.

1,431 initiatives published

13,409 actions carried out

29,766 citizen sentinels

The Sentinelles de la Nature project is led at the regional level by environmental protection associations and federations (particularly by France Nature Environnement), Sentinelles de la Nature was launched in 2015 in Isère and now covers the entire mainland, as well as French Guiana.

How do you submit a report on Sentinelles de la Nature?

You can become a Sentinelles de la Nature member in just a few clicks:

1. On the website, click on "Report"
2. Select your region and the type of report you wish to make
3. Create your account and your profile
4. Submit your report (you can then add to it or edit it)

Note: Your identity will never be made public, but you are responsible for the information you provide. You also agree to submit photos that are free of copyright.

The person in charge of Sentinelles de la Nature in your region will review your report and decide on the best way to handle it. They may contact you to ask for further details before publication.
