Farmers' Health

The Association for the Health of the Earth and Living Beings, drawing on the expertise of its Scientific Committee members, offers its members—as well as the general public—several health topics specific to farmers.

These notes provide an overview of the diseases most commonly encountered among farmers and within their families—who are also at risk—and propose solutions.

Synthetic meat

In recent years, we have begun to hear about a product referred to by its developers as “synthetic meat,” developed in a laboratory using the latest biotechnological innovations to replace meat of animal origin. These products, which use animal cells and are known as “in vitro meat” or “synthetic meat,” do not come from muscle tissue derived from the carcasses of animals born, raised, and slaughtered in the traditional manner. **They should not be marketed and sold under the term “meat.”**
